### **Punctuality**

We have had a growing number of children arriving late for school recently. Lessons begin at 8:45am with the doors opening at 8:40am. Please ensure that your child arrives at school on time every single day.

5 minutes late every day = 3 days of school lost a year

15 minutes late every day = 10 days of school lost a year

20 minutes late every day = 13 days of school lost a year

30 minutes late every day = 19 days of school lost a year
