

Dear Parents and Carers

I have been asked to forward to you a letter from Cath McEvoy, the Executive Director of Adult Social Care and Children's Services at Northumberland County Council, which has been posted on the letters section of our website.

The letter echoes the sentiments of letters that you have received from me.

On a personal level, prior to an advertisement being placed early in January, writing to you again has given me the opportunity to inform you of my decision to retire from my post of Headteacher of Ellington Primary School at the end of the current academic year.
