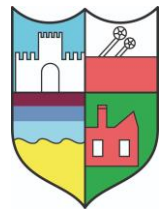

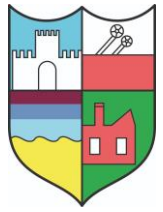

## **Outcome:**

Self-harm is increasing and getting worse

The use of alcohol in Northumberland is increasing and getting worse – education needed on the harm of alcohol use

Under 16-conception rate is slightly above national average - important to educate children on conception and pregnancy

Jobs and low-income families – well above the national average so it is important that at Ellington we educate our children on careers, economics and the importance of having a job – opportunities.

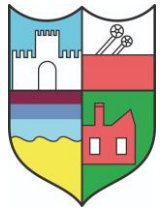

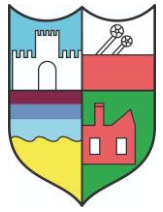
