

In Literacy, children will listen and respond to our key texts including acting out and retelling parts of our key stories. They will continue to learn how to write their name, focusing on forming their letters correctly. The children will continue to take part in daily Phonics activities which will develop their speaking and listening skills. The children will orally blend and segment words and begin to recognise words with the same initial sound. We will also be focussing on rhyme and alliteration.



Our topic this half term is a journey to... the woods, space and the seaside.

We will learn about different occupations including a tree surgeon, coast guards and astronauts. The children will understand how space travel has changed over time and we will look at the first moon landing. We will observe changes in our outdoor garden and local area in Summer. The children will begin to understand the need to respect and care for the natural environment and living things.

strengthen our gross motor skills, the children will


use the different PE apparatus. We will also con-
