Attendance this year is currently **95.14%** which is below our target of 96% but is an increase on attendance in recent years. We continue to have some children who are persistent absentees however this figure is down to 9% from 18% at the start of this academic year. Six referrals have been made to Education Welfare, two children are currently under formal monitoring

periods. Jenny Dyer and I have met with the EWO (Lisa Waugh) monthly this year. We are supporting some families via the EWO and via Early Help.

We have continued with a weekly focus on attendance in assembly with class prizes and we will be having our termly prizes also.

We are proposing to fall in line with the majority of other primary schools under Northumberland County Control and introduce penalty fines in the next academic year. A new attendance policy will be shared in the summer term for approval.

## School Improvement Plan

## <u>Quality of Education</u>

We are continuing to work towards delivering outstanding teaching and learning across the school. Our English curriculum is fully embedded and writing standards are improving in all year groups. Mr McConville has been supporting staff through coaching, modelling and team teaching with the delivery of our new maths curriculum. He has also been working closely with Science consultant, Phil Watkins, to further improve our Science Curriculum. All subject leads have continued to monitor their subjects and develop their leadership skills.

## Leadership and Management

Leadership has been further strengthened through the appointment of Amy Milne as Early Years Lead working alongside Mr McConville, Mrs Sanders, Mrs Morris and I as part of the Senior Leadership Team. All senior leaders are fully aware of the school development plan and the short and long term aims of this. All school staff worked together to identify successes and next steps with the development plan on the Inset day. Mr McConville, Mrs Sanders, Mrs Milne and Mrs Horsley are all completing National Professional Qualifications.

## Early Years

Mrs Milne has made an excellent start in her role as Early Years Lead. She has been working closely with our Northumberland County Council Early Years consultant, Rosy Dickinson, and visiting a range of settings to help develop our own provision. Several parent events have taken place including stay and play and stay and read. It is vitally important that we foster excellent relationships with parents/carers from the day children start at Ellington.

### Personal Development

We believe that Personal development is Outstanding at Ellington. We ensure all children have a wide range of experiences and enrichment so that no matter what their background, they have equal opportunities at Ellington. We know the importance of pupil voice and we have frequent school council, eco-council and subject leader pupil voice activities taking place.

#### <u>Behaviour and Attitudes</u>

Behaviour continues to be outstanding across the school. We have had no serious incidents. Staff have the highest of expectations from all pupils. We are frequently complemented on trips and visits for the superb behaviour of our children. Children understand our school rules, they show respect for themselves and others and live our school values each and every day.

# <u>Safeguarding</u>

Safeguarding reviews have taken place with Danielle Towers (safeguarding lead governor) and Mick Dunn (Clennell Education link advisor) which have shown that safeguarding remains a strength of the school. All staff are fully trained following our annual refresher and they are fully aware of safeguarding procedures. An updated audit has been completed for 2023/2024 and this has created a small action plan.

Currently in school we have:

- One child in Nursery is subject to a child protection plan.
- One child in Year 6 is subject to a child in need plan.
- We are supporting five families working alongside Early Help.
- We have three previously looked after children and one looked after child on roll.
- All safeguarding is logged on CPOMS.
- We continue to use SENSO to monitor all online activity.
- A safeguarding element is included in every newsletter.

# <u>Parent Feedback</u>

During our Autumn term parent consultations, we asked parents to complete questionnaires. The results are as follows:

- 99% of parents/carers feel that their child enjoys coming to Ellington Primary School.
- 99% of parents/carers believe that their child feels safe at Ellington Primary School.
- 100% of parents/carers feel that Ellington Primary School makes sure its pupils are well behaved.
- 99% of parents/carers feel that they are kept informed about what their children learn at Ellington Primary School.
- 98% of parents/carers feel that their child does well at Ellington Primary School.
- 98% of parents/carers feel that Ellington Primary School has high expectations for their children.
- 100% of parents/carers feel that their a good range of subjects available for their child at Ellington Primary School.
- 99% of parents/carers feel that there is a good range of extra-curricular clubs available at Ellington Primary School.
- 99% of parents/carers feel that Ellington Primary School supports their child's wider Personal Development.
- 100% of parents surveyed would recommend Ellington Primary School to other families.

## <u>Curriculum</u>

We have made great progress with our curriculum over the past two years and the majority of areas are now fully embedded. Our major focus this academic year have been further embedding the Ellington Writing Journey and the introduction of Big Maths. Writing is the main area of development for our children and through staff training, coaching and modelling by Mrs Sanders, we can see excellent progress across the school. Our reading curriculum is outstanding and has therefore led to further improvements in writing. Big Maths has had a great impact. Again, excellent staff CPD has enabled all staff to deliver this with confidence. Expectations have risen and the children's knowledge is growing rapidly.

### <u>School Nurse</u>

The appointment of Ciara Drape as our school nurse has been a real success. Ciara is part of My School Health and has been supporting pupils, parents and staff in a whole range of areas. She has built excellent relationships with children and many families and we hope to increase her time in school if possible.

## Charity Work

As part of our Wider World curriculum driver, we are continuing to support a range of different charities this year. We want to use our position as a school to educate the children and support a variety of worthwhile charities. So far this year, we have supported The Red Sky Foundation, The Pearl of Africa Choir, Beyond Mental Health, Wansbeck Valley Foodbank, Salvation Army, Children in Need, Save the Children, Comic Relief and Place2Be raising a significant amount of money to date.
