Halloween Disco

When we return on October 31st, we have our Halloween discos. This Halloween having two we are separate discos for EYFS/KS1 (Nursery, Reception, Year 1 and Year 2) and for KS2 (Years 3 to 6). EYFS/ KS1 will have their disco from 4:00pm to 5:30pm. KS2 will have their disco from 6:00pm to 7:30pm. The discos are for pupils only and tickets cost £3 each, which includes entry, a hot dog, crisps and juice. Tickets can be purchased on the morning of the 31st October until 12noon, but children cannot pay on the door as we need to pre-buy the food and drinks. Children can bring the £3 into school in a named envelope and hand this in to their teacher.

# **Reception News**

We have had a busy time in Reception over the last two weeks. In Literacy, we have been reading and learning about the story 'Supertato' by Sue Hendra and Paul Linnet. The evil pea character in the story gets up to all sorts of mischief. He has even been causing mischief in our classroom when we have not been at school. We created wanted posters and painted pictures of the evil pea to see if we could catch him.

In maths, we have continued our learning on subitising, composition and comparison. Mrs Cook is super impressed with the maths work that has been happening in Reception!

> An activity that we have really enjoyed was looking at photographs of ourselves from when we were babies. We played a game where we had to look at each photo and match them up with the person each baby has grown into. We then took it in turns to talk about any memories that we could remember from when we were little.

We have been learning about a special celebration called Diwali. Diwali is the festival of lights and many rituals and traditions in the event include light so we made our own paper plate lamp craft. We have also been doing Rangoli patterns and hand art crafts.

We have also been learning about harvest. We talked about how harvest festival is a celebration of the food grown on the land and looked together at some different pictures that link to harvest.

What a fantastic first half term Year 1 have had. They have settled brilliantly into their new environment and routines.

In these final weeks we have been learning how to write letters particularly focusing on letters of apology. The children have all written an apology letter to Bear from Rabbit for taking his red, triangular hat. In Maths we have continued our counting forwards and backwards within 100. They are struggling with the bridging 10 when counting backwards so please continue to work on this at home.

# Year 2 News

It has been a lovely last week in Year 2 with all of our Harvest preparations. Thank you so much to all of the parents who came to see our either of our two performances. It has been an incredibly busy half term and it is hard to get to speak to parents at the start and end of a day, so it was great to have ten minutes to have a proper conversation.

As well as getting ready for the harvest festival, in English we have also planned and written our first draft of a diary entry based around the short film The Cloudmaker. The children are definitely building their pace and stamina for writing.

In Maths, we have been learning to add three addends. We have been using our knowledge of bonds to 10 to help with this.

In computing, we have been learning to use a mouse and we practised this skill by making marks on Paintz.app.

In History, we started to look at how London changed after the Great Fire.

I have stuck a letter into the children's homework books with a piece of optional holiday homework and instructions on using Times Table Rockstars as the children now have their log in details in their books. Thanks, and have a lovely half term.







# Year 3 News

Time has flown past, and it is hard to believe that we are already at half term! It has been great to get to know the class better and they have impressed us every day.



The last two weeks of English have focused on a fantastic animation called 'Once in a Lifetime' which really captured the children's imaginations, and they have written some excellent news articles about the events. I wonder if they can

recount them to you? We also loved our hour in the beautiful new school library and we're looking forward to next half term's slot!



In maths, we have continued to focus on place value, and using this to help us do a range of additions and subtractions without the need for formal written methods! I have been impressed every week with the children's arithmetic skills and they are getting so good at explaining their reasoning.

Computing this half term has involved learning about digital devices and how they are connected to networks. The children enjoyed designing toys demonstrating their understanding of input and output devices, as well as drawing their own personal networks and even role playing the different devices in a network!

# Year 4 News

n the run up to our half term holiday, the children have continued to impress and many adults around the school have commented upon how excellent Year 4 have been! Well done Year 4!

During our English lessons, we finished and published our persuasive leaflets for the Grand High Witch's new academy and they were thoroughly enjoyable to read. We used features such as the "rule of three", rhetorical questions to engage our readers and conjunctive adverbs to create cohesion within our work. In the run up to our harvest assembly, the children have been working on their performance poetry, which we very much hope you enjoy on Friday morning.

In maths, the children have continued with place value and looking at thousands as well as exploring the use of Gattegno charts, part-part-whole models and bar models to apply our understanding in different ways.





We also had a lovely visit to our new library last week. The children were very excited and enjoyed a book (or three) in the comfort of the new bean bags and reading corners.





# Year 5 News

After 6 weeks, the children have completed their myth and legend stories! They have worked tremendously hard on this piece of writing and should be very proud of themselves. Throughout each published writing piece, the children have included setting descriptions, character descriptions, fight scenes and speech between characters.





Our 5-week maths topic of decimal fractions tenths and hundredth is now complete and the children have progressed really well from where they started in September to now having a secure understanding of tenths and hundredths.

In geography, we have been learning all about how tourism can have positive and negative effects on specific mountain regions around the world. We then explored how these effects can be categorised into social, economic and environmental impacts.



In RE the children have been learning about special places around the world that are very important to Christians. We have been learning how to say the days of the week and months of the year in French. In art, the children practised their sketching skills in the form of a house before learning how to 'mono-print' a piece of work.



I have been super impressed with all the children this half term; their attitude to their learning, their behaviour and their willingness to try their best has collectively made this half term very enjoyable for everyone.
