Literacy

In Literacy, the older children will begin to learn letter sounds using the RWI phonics programme. The younger children will focus on listening activities and using this to recognise environmental sounds. When reading stories we will encourage the children to talk about the places and people in stories and the important things that are happening. We will support the older children to write the letters in their name.



We will be learning about people who help us and what their job role is. We will have police, fire and medical visitors for the children to explore and learn about each occupation. We will also look at how these occupations have changed over time.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development

We will recap the nursery rules and understand why rules are important. We will name our feelings and understand simple strategies to manage them. For our younger children we will encourage independence skills.

Communication and Language

The children will develop their vocabulary linked to superheroes and people who help us. They will be encouraged to tell a story using props and recalling events in their own lives. For our older children we will be asking them to follow longer instructions. For our younger children we will ask them to follow simple instructions

Expressive Art & Design

Children will be able to explore a range of resources and decide what to make. They will begin to plan how they want to make something and will design and create their own superveggie! We will explore how to create dens and yow to make them stronger.

Key Stories

This half term we will ensure our younger children have a good knowledge of their colours and encourage good counting skills. For our older children we will consolidate our knowledge of 5 using counting, subitising, ordering and number facts. We will also explore 2-d and 3-d shapes.

Physical Development

This half term, we will be continue to learn ball skills. We will learn how to use our feet to control a ball. We will learn to dribble and pass using a football. We will take part in a weekly gross motor day too. For our older children we will be encouraging pencil control and scissor skills ready for Reception.
