Our reading text is *The Boy in the Tower* by Polly Ho-Yen. This is the story of a boy who lives in an urban tower block where strange things start occurring around him. In writing, we will be doing some work on effective dialogue as well as exploring a Shakespeare play: *Romeo and Juliet*. We will use this to inspire a letter as well as work on our speaking skills with a debate.

Science

Pupils will explore the Darwinian concept of "survival of the fittest" and how animals have adapted over time to suit their environments during our unit on adaptation and variation.



French

Maths
